"THE VALUE OF CIRCULATING TUMOR DNA AS A PROGNOSTIC MARKER IN COLORECTAL CANCER"

PELVIC PHYSIOTHERAPY AND PELVIC FLOOR REHABILITATION IN PATIENTS UNDERGOING SURGERY FOR COLORECTAL CANCER:

A WORKSHOP FOR HEALTHCARE PROFESSIONALS



This one-day workshop is designed for healthcare professionals working with individuals who have undergone colorectal surgery. Participants will gain in-depth knowledge and practical skills in the assessment and management of pelvic floor dysfunction post-surgery.

Objectives:

- Enhance understanding of pelvic floor anatomy and physiology in relation to bowel function.
- Identify common challenges faced by patients after colorectal surgery and their impact on quality of life.
- Develop skills in performing a comprehensive pelvic floor assessment for this population.
- Learn evidence-based pelvic floor muscle training (PFMT) techniques for various post-surgical presentations.
- Integrate additional self-management strategies for optimal patient recovery.

CASE 1: FEMALE PATIENT WITH LARS (LOW ANTERIOR RESECTION SYNDROME)

Objectives:

- Female, 2 months post-surgery for low anterior resection of a rectal adenocarcinoma.
- Reports urgency, frequency, and occasional leakage of stool, particularly with physical activity.
- Experiences occasional abdominal discomfort and bloating.
- Has difficulty coordinating pelvic floor muscle contractions and reports feeling "weak" down there.

Assessment:

- Digital rectal examination reveals weakened pelvic floor musculature with poor coordination and endurance.
- Perineometer assessment confirms decreased squeeze pressure and prolonged relaxation time.

Intervention:

- Targeted PFMT focusing on strengthening and coordinating the levator ani muscles.
- Biofeedback training to improve awareness and control of pelvic floor contractions.
- Dietary and lifestyle modifications to manage urgency and bowel consistency.
- Education on proper toileting posture and strategies for managing leakage.

Outcomes:

- Significant improvement in bowel control symptoms within 3 months of consistent PFMT.
- Reduced frequency and urgency episodes.
- · Improved confidence and quality of life.



CASE 2: MALE PATIENT WITH STOMA CLOSURE AND PELVIC FLOOR DYSFUNCTION

Presentation:

- · Male, 6 months post-surgery for stoma closure following rectal adenocarcinoma
- Experiences difficulty initiating bowel movements and incomplete evacuation.
- · Reports straining and occasional rectal prolapse during defecation.
- Feels discomfort and tightness in the perineal area.

Assessment:

- Physical examination reveals pelvic floor hypertonicity and tenderness in the anal sphincter muscles.
- Defecography confirms incomplete rectal emptying and paradoxical contraction of the pelvic floor during straining.
- · Stoma closure decision

Intervention:

- Pelvic floor relaxation techniques and myofascial release to address muscle tightness and pain.
- Sensory retraining to improve awareness of rectal fullness and appropriate timing for initiating defecation.
- Biofeedback training to facilitate coordinated relaxation of the pelvic floor during defecation.

Outcomes:

- Reduced straining and improved rectal emptying within 2 months of therapy.
- · Resolution of rectal prolapse symptoms.

Improved quality of life and decreased anxiety around bowel function.

Workshop Materials:

- Participants will receive a comprehensive handout with detailed information on anatomy, assessment techniques, PFMT protocols, and self-management strategies.
- A list of resources for further learning and clinical practice will be provided.

Additional Notes:

- The workshop is designed for healthcare professionals (doctors, physiotherapists, nurses-limited number with total 30 participants) with a basic understanding of pelvic floor physiotherapy.
- Participants are encouraged to wear comfortable clothing that allows for movement and active participation.
- Ample opportunity will be provided for questions, discussion, and hands-on practice throughout the workshop.
