I hope only I have it, the feeling of feeling a little lonely, a little isolated. However, it seems we all feel more or less the same... Let's throw these things to the winds for a while. #### WHAT'S WHAT ?

There are different modalities used by our university for different purposes in the distance education process. The ones used the most actively for distance education are Zoom, ALMS (EYS) and ASOS.

We use Zoom in activities where we can interact with teachers and classmates at the same time, like lectures. Also, we can use Zoom for examinations in different ways in different departments.

ALMS (Acıbadem Learning Management System or EYS in Turkish) is a system created to hold asynchronous lectures and a portal which we use to upload homework and take theoretical exams.

ASOS (Exam Automation System) is our portal where the written exams are held in School of Medicine.

We will give detailed information about mentioned modalities.



There are many different activities that are planned to be held on Zoom. Information about these activities is out of the scope of this handbook. That information will be provided in the beginning of the year by your Dean's Office and your lecturers.

Zoom will be used for mainly Synchronous Lectures in this year. Also, some departments will use Zoom as an oral exam platform and others will use theoretical exam supervising platform.

#### **Introduction**

As you might know, one of the advantages of Zoom is that it does not require any subscription and you can immediately join the meetings you're invited to. Meeting invitations are usually announced via mail and you are expected to be there. Sometimes lecturers may forget to accept your join requests after the meeting has started so I suggest you to join the meeting early. An example of a waiting room:





You can join Zoom meetings in two ways as seen above. You can join the meeting by clicking on the invitation link (which I think is far easier) or you can open the application and join by entering the meeting ID and password. For both methods you should have the Zoom application on your phone or computer. Even though phones are okay for the lectures most of the times, you are not allowed to use phones for exams. Consequently, I would strongly advise that you use a computer with a webcam allowing your face to be seen.

#### **During Meetings**

Though each lecturer has their own style for the meetings, I want to mention a few important points:

- In most departments, it is obliged to open cameras during the meeting, otherwise we can be written as absent. If you cannot open it for some reason, tell your lecturer at the beginning of the session.
- The clothing code is smart casual in most cases, but for examinations I suggest you to wear formal (for men: wear a tie).
- You can use backgrounds for the lectures when you do not feel like cleaning your room or if it is unsuitable. However, it is forbidden to use Zoom backgrounds in the examinations.

- Mics of participants should be kept muted other than the lecturer. You can speak by holding the "space" button when you need to. I would not suggest using the mouse to unmute as you may forget to close your mic. You can have snacks in the lectures but try not to distract the lecturer. You may exit the field of view of the cam or close it for a short period of time as you eat.
- Especially in our experience with emergency distance learning, there were times where we cannot find a break to even eat in our live lectures reaching 7-8 hours.
- You should be prepared for your lectures because all the activities are planned assuming that you're well prepared. Do not think that it would be any less embarrassing just because you are not face to face, be responsible as if you are in the classroom.
- In the meetings, attendances will be taken by class representatives or by lecturers. You should get used to this new attendance system. Attendance may be taken at the end of the lecture so you should not leave the meeting before the meeting is ended by the lecturer.
- If you keep your notes on your computer, you can easily search them by using the program's search function (ctrl+f).
- If you lose your internet connection for whatever reason during the meeting, do not worry. You will automatically re-join when you re-establish your internet connection if you do not close your application.
- If you are late for the meeting it is not shameful for your friend to make a little request to the lecturer to let you in.
- Class representatives can request co-host status from the lecturer to relieve them from that responsibility considering his/her temperament.
- Finally, don't forget to include your school number next to your name, it is very important to have your number when taking attendance.

ALMS (EYS) EMRE KAR, SCHOOL OF MEDICINE YEAR VI

As we mentioned in the introduction, you will be using LMS to watch pre-recorded lessons prepared for you to learn the subject before coming to the live lesson and to submit any homework that you may have.

You can access the system through the following link: https://acibadem.almscloud.com. After a while, if you write "alms" on your browser and forget the address, you can go to https://www.acibadem.edu.tr (or click on the first result when typing Acibadem Uni on google) and click on the EYS button (Education Management Systems) located at the top, as seen below.



Then you will sign in to the system with your student number and password assigned to you. You can save your password in your browser. Adding this web-address to favourites or bookmarks on your browser would make it easier to access later.

#### <u>Portal</u>

Upon logging into the system, you will automatically have a lot of notifications in blue boxes (no messages, no polls, no activities to start soon, etc.), don't bother with closing them every time, as they will come out again next time. You can see a menu at the top right, a menu on the left, and if you scroll down the page you will see a list of the courses you're enrolled in. All three methods will lead to the same result. You can locate "my lectures" (Derslerim) on the left, the notebook icon on the top right; and finally, at the bottom each individual courses. My personal preference is the top right menu as seen in the picture below, because it loads faster, I can go directly to the courses with one click and see what percentage of the course I have completed.

You will not be using most of the remaining tabs actively because most of them will work through the other systems as I mentioned at the introduction (such as BademNET for forum, OBS for notes, e-mail with .edu extension etc.).

#### **Homeworks**

Homeworks are given over Alms in many departments. Since this system is used in some departments instead of exams, I would like to briefly mention here.

First of all, you may not get a notification about a homework if you don't visit this website every now and then. Therefore, even if you are watching the lectures, I recommend you to check for any homework by logging in this system in the meantime. When an assignment is given, the bell sign in the upper right menu will be change its color and you will be able to view the assignment from there. If you click on this notification, you can still view the assignment until the declared deadline. If you do not wish to access the assignment this way, then you may access the assignment from the list of the relevant course as instructed above. After downloading and completing your assignment, you can go to the same page again and upload your homework. If you cannot upload your homework by communicating with your lecturer you can send your homework via mail.

#### **Course List/Catalog**

As you can see above, when you click on the course, you will see the list of individual lectures. Sometimes, all the lectures may not appear when you first view them or all the assignments may not be visible but all information about them will be given to you in detail by the Lecturer at the beginning of the course. If you encounter a problem, you can contact your professor by using your given school e-mail. The question and its answer, will be shared by your Year Representative, and he/she will share the answer with your classmates. Therefore, be careful to keep these mails as formal as possible. If you think that you are lacking in this regard, refer to the "How to write an official e-mail guide" that the Dean's office of your faculty has sent/will send.

You will see a page similar to the one in the above image. You can download the documents and watch the videos through the browser. Each task has its own completion criteria. Some can be completed just by viewing the document or some videos may require a viewing rate of 90% to be completed. You can see them by hovering over the yellow-coloured "Tamamlama Kriteri" found to the left of the relevant material. **ALMS EXAMINATION SYSTEM**

• We are logging in to Alms by using our school ID and password which is shown below.



- Our quiz usually appears on the home page after logging in. If it is not visible, you can view your exam by clicking on the lesson your exam is from the lessons section. If it still does not appear, you must contact the instructor of the lesson.
- You have to click on your exam at the exam start time. If you did not click on the start time, you will not be able to enter the exam if you clicked late. First, you have to read the exam instructions and click the "I read, I agree" button. Then you can start when your teacher says so.
- The number of questions, the duration and the type of the exam depend on our teachers. During the exam, our teachers monitor us from "Zoom". After pressing the "Next" button, we can't return to the questions.
- After marking your answer, if the color of the number of question on the right is "blue", your answer has been saved. If you checked but it is not blue, you need to contact the instructor of the box.
- You can see your remaining time at the middle right in the exam.
- If you experience any disconnection during the exam, the time will continue until you reconnect, connect as fast as possible. You have the right to disconnect for 2 times. Reach your teacher at the third disconnection.
- System will shut down automatically when the exam time is over.

#### Hello My Friend,

In our university, different faculties and departments use different examination systems that best suits their goals while making their exams. LMS (EYS) and ASOS (Exam Automation System) are the most frequently used of these. In this section, I will give you information about ASOS and online exams held in our School of Medicine.

The exams are designed to evaluate how well the student is able to achieve the curriculum's learning objectives. As you progress through your years in your own faculty and department, the questions you encounter in exams will become more and more similar to the cases you will encounter once you graduate.

The theoretical exams conducted on paper in face-to-face education are going to be conducted online using the ASOS system in distance education. I will explain the whole process, from registering for the exam to how you can see the exam analysis, in 3 sections: before, during and after the exam. At the end, I will summarize the things you need to pay attention to and list my recommendations. You can reach the more detailed and official version from <u>this link</u>; I strongly recommend you to read the official version.



#### <u>Before the Exam</u>

- Make sure to arrange a quiet, calm environment suitable for exam taking; It is also your responsibility to prepare a secure internet and electricity connection/charge your computer in advance in a way that will not cause any problems during the exam. If you are in Istanbul, you can go to the campus and take the exam using the computers there.
- During the exam, there will be supervision over Zoom. You cannot use the same computer you're taking the exam on to connect to Zoom. I'd suggest using your phone for this. Be sure to prepare your seat and set up your phone's position before the exam, and be sure to test it so that it won't fall during the exam. I'm adding a sample photo for you <sup>(C)</sup>. The phone's camera should capture a clear view of your desk, face and computer screen.



• Also make sure that your Zoom application is up to date, otherwise you may run into problems at the last minute.

- You may only take the exam on a personal computer, you may not connect to the exam from your mobile phone/tablet. You should use Firefox version 78, Chrome 86, Microsoft Edge 83, Safari 13.1 and above as a browser, but these versions can be downloaded if the computer's operating system is on the developer version. You can quickly download and install Firefox version 78 (<u>link</u>), which I found after some research and used for my exams without any problems. On the page that opens, download one of the options on the left. If you're using Windows select the 64-bit option, if you're using a Mac you should select the macOS option. I use this browser only for exams, and I suggest you do that too. After downloading and installing Firefox browser, you are ready for the exam mails.
- 24 hours before the exam, you must register for the exam via your school email account which the extension has "@live.acibadem.edu.tr". On your school email account, you should receive email from an asos@acibadem.edu.tr notifying that "Exam registration has been made!". Open the email and right "Confirm click on My Registration" in the blue box, then click "Copy link" from the options, open your browser, paste the link into the search bar, and press the "Enter" key.



A message should appear notifying you "Your registration is complete. Your entrance information has been sent to your email address. " Soon after, the exam confirmation mail will be sent to your e-mail address. Below is an example of a mail confirmation email you should receive upon confirming registration. Be sure to check that the displayed student ID number and T.C. Kimlik (Turkish ID) number are correct and read the instructions provided in the email. Although it varies from exam to exam, 30-60 minutes before the exam you will be able to access the exam entry screen. To do so, you may right click the exam link labeled "Sınava Bağlan" (which is marked by the green arrow in the below image), copy the link, paste it into the search bar in your browser and press the "Enter" key. When you arrive at the exam entry screen, connect to the exam using the security code labeled "Guvenlik Kodu", marked below by the red arrow.

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- Unfortunately, ASOS only has menu options in Turkish for now. If you are an international student and do not have a good command of Turkish, do not be afraid to notify the responsible people or the head of the biomedical subject committee before the exam. They will help you.
- The phone numbers of the relevant academicians will be provided in the information mail sent to you before the exam. If you encounter any problems during the exam, you can ask for assistance, either by telling your supervisor on Zoom or by calling the relevant instructors from any other available phone.

• You have better connect to the exam and Zoom 30 minutes before the exam. To avoid any problems, connect at least 15 minutes beforehand, otherwise you may not be admitted to the exam. The screenshot below is an example of what you should see upon connecting to the exam before it begins:



#### During the Exam

• When the exam starts, the list of rules will appear as shown below. These are the same exam rules given to you beforehand. In order not to waste any time, start your exam by ticking the box at the bottom saying that you agree with the rules of the exam.



When the exam starts, the questions will be displayed one by one. The total time (red pill) remaining in the upper left and the remaining time (blue pill) for the question on the upper right will appear on the counter as in the example below. At this point, I recommend that you control your excitement and focus on the incoming questions and let yourself go with the flow of the exam. The time limit per question is something we are not used to before. I never felt the pressure of this because I started playing time-limited chess at the beginning of the pandemic <sup>(C)</sup>. There are many online chess sites. I recommend <u>this website.</u>



- You should only click the option you think is correct and the save button. Try to click the save button only once, as clicking too many times may cause problems with the system.
- Sometimes, due to a slowdown in your internet connection, one of the time counters may get stuck. You can continue without worrying. The main thing you need to pay attention to is the remaining time to answer the question and make sure the questions you marked are marked in black on the coding paper on the left.

- If you want to leave the question blank, you can check the "Leave the question blank" button and click "Save" before the time set per question is over, and you can leave the question blank and see it again before the total exam time is over. The questions you left blank will appear unmarked on the coding paper on the left. Another point you should pay attention to is the permission to see the blank questions again varies from exam to exam. While you won't be able to view questions a second time in some exams, you can go back as many times as you want in others. Make sure to read and understand the rules for each exam.
- One of the most important aspects that makes an exam valid is exam security. To ensure exam security, the supervisors will be checking you on Zoom and the ASOS system will be monitoring your computer during the exam. There should be a blank paper, pencil and eraser and only water on the desk to make small notes like in the example photo. Aside from having another tab open in your browser, no other program should be open on your computer.
- I recommend that you do not exit your browser's full screen mode during the exam unless you have any problems. If you go to the desktop many times, the system will throw you out of the exam and you need to go to your e-mail and reconnect to the exam by clicking the "Connect to exam"(Sinava Bağlan) button again.
- If there is a technical problem and the system kicks you out of the exam/your browser closes, don't panic: you can go back to the e-mail, and click the "Connect to the exam" button to reconnect quickly.
- Once you have gone through every question, the system will pop up a message box. If you have any questions left blank, go back and complete the blanks. After completing all the blanks, you can save and exit your quiz by clicking the "Finish" button. Good luck.

#### My Suggestions

In this section, I will make some suggestions which make my exam process easier:

- If you have a disconnection problem during the exam or the system somehow kicks you, I recommend you download Outlook as a mail program where you can easily access the exam entry email to reconnect to the exam.
- One of the priviliges provided by our university is that students can download Office 365 applications for free. Go to the <u>university website</u> and log in from the student Webmail under the Webmail on the home page. On the page that opens, log in with the university mail and password, and the following screen will appear. You can get many Office applications for free, including Outlook, by clicking the "Install Office applications" section in the red box.

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• After the Office apps are installed, open the Outlook app and add the school mail account. By adding the shortcut of the program to the toolbar of your computer, you can access your mail account very quickly.

• As I mentioned previously, I use the Firefox browser only for the exam. I changed a few settings of the browser to make it easier for me to connect to the exam. First, let's open browser settings as shown below.



When you go to settings, the screen below will appear. As you can see in the red box below, when you select the "Restore previous session" option when starting the browser, it will automatically open the sites that were open when the browser last closed. So how can we use this feature to facilitate exam entry? Keep reading and apply the steps below <sup>(S)</sup>

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- The day before the exam, I right click on the connect to the exam button and copy the link. I open Firefox and close all other tabs, keeping one empty tab. I paste the exam entry link I copied into the search bar and press the "Enter" key. At this point, I close the browser. In this way, it will automatically load the exam entry page as soon as I open it tomorrow. So how can you easily copy your security code/exam login password?
- Just like the login link, if you open a new tab and paste your password into the search bar, press the "Enter" key and close the browser, you will only need to open your browser right before the exam. One tab will open the entrance page for the exam, the other tab will have the security code, and you can easily connect to the exam by copying and pasting it in the relevant place on the exam linking screen.
- We are all so used to solving questions on paper. Not being able to highlight the choices you have eliminated while solving a problem on the computer, and not being able to write a note you want to write, especially when you have to leave the question blank, can cause a waste of time. That's why I recommend you put a blank sheet of paper on your desk before you start. In this way, writing down the number of the question you are stuck with and taking a quick note of which options you have eliminated will save you some time when you tackle the question a second time.

If you have continued reading so far, here's your gift, follow the link: <u>"All is well."</u> (3 Idiots, 2009)

- To view the detailed analysis of your exam you can log into the ASOS system after the grades are announced.
- You can login to the system by using your school e-mail address and a password that you will set. Be sure to capitalize the first characters of your name and surname.
- After logging in, you can access the exam analysis by choosing "Exams" and then "My Results" from the menu on the left. In here, you can see your exam grades as well as the numbers of correct, incorrect answers and unanswered questions.
- Exam analysis and grade distribution pages will open after selecting the exam that you want to see the details of.
- You can see the subjects and lecturers and whether you answered their questions correct or incorrect. Thus, you'll know which subjects you know well and the ones that you should focus on more.
